 The committee completed the Needs and Gaps for FY23. A few comments below during conversation:
 Lewiston is in the process of reviewing tiny houses
 Clarkston is working on additional affordable housing through Catholic charities
- Senior Housing Project Loren Beauchamp, Manager, Interlink Volunteer Agency Loren reported that he is talking with a 501-c3 group in Spokane that has senior housing throughout the United States. This is a project he has taken on himself and is open to assistance and gathering new information and data.
- Update on Sober Living Grant and sober house in Lewiston Shaun Hollace Shaun purchased a single wide trailer located near the Mill. He and his business partner have begun filling beds. There are 2 RV spots on the property. This would probably be open up for either older or newer RV's.

They're trying to purchase additional properties.

- Update on Union Gospel Mission (if available) Ken Miller/Frank Wright No update at this time. It was heard in the community that UGM Thrift Shop closed. Lisa will follow up with a call to Ken Miller to get an update and clarification on the Thrift Shop.
- Miscellaneous

An idea for persons with disabilities is to look at the Oxford House model. Clearwater-ceda.org – Clearwater Economic Development Association Cara to speak with Barbara Leachman to be contacted Intermountain Fair Housing and ID housing are partnering Cynthia Nunez was unable to make it the meeting but was able to provide an update from the Lewiston School District. Resource Social Workers have seen an increase in the number of homeless families. Intermountain Fair Housing has been quick to respond. They're paying 2 months rent for 2 families, giving them time to figure things out. They have families in tents, campers, jumping from one camp ground to another. Parents and kids are very stressed. Its been very difficult.
